Barriers affecting rates and making our society more vulnerable to the diseases they prevent include lack of knowledge, cost, fear of pain, poor record-keeping, time/ transportation issues and recent anti-vaccine messages. All of these barriers serve to make Mid America Immunization Coalition's promotion of immunizations among the entire population of the metro area even more urgent, because if there is one thing we know, it's that vaccines work.
